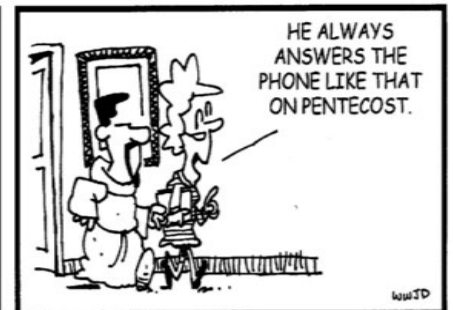

### PENTECOST





**PENTECOST SUNDAY:  
ACTS 2:1-11; 1 COR 12:3B-7, 12-13; JN 20:19-23**

Our Easter season culminates with the glorious feast of Pentecost. Pentecost, the day 50 days after Easter when the Holy Spirit descended on Mary and the apostles in the form of tongues of fire. We also celebrate this day as the birthday of the Church, for shortly after this event, St. Peter preached his first homily.

The Holy Spirit is just as alive and willing to work here and now in our day-to-day moments as back at our first Pentecost. It is our call as Christian disciples to be attentive and open to these workings. By the power of the Holy Spirit, God is in us and always around us, yet we must call upon His name, seek His guidance, and become aware of His presence in our lives.

Pentecost is one of the three most important feasts of the Church year. We know Christmas is the first. It's easy to get excited about the birth of a baby, especially when the baby is God's Son, and his mother is the Virgin Mary. We know the feast of Jesus' resurrection is the most important feast of all because if there were no resurrection, we would have no faith or hope at all. But Pentecost seems like another ordinary Sunday, although it is the third most important feast.

Let me give you a little history of Pentecost. It was not invented by the Church. The Jews were celebrating Pentecost 3,000 years ago, that is, 1,000 years before Jesus' birth. It was originally a harvest feast on which the first fruits were offered in gratitude to God. It later came to be celebrated as the anniversary of the giving of the Law to Moses on Mt. Sinai. The word itself means simply 50th, the 50th day after Jewish Passover. The Jews were celebrating that feast when the Spirit came on Jesus' followers. And so Pentecost is still celebrated, but we who are Christians celebrate it as the day on which God sent his Holy Spirit upon the Church.

Pentecost isn't just the celebration of a past event. It is important for us today because the Holy Spirit is important for us today. The Spirit is hard to picture because the Spirit is within us when we are in God's grace. The Spirit is like the air we breathe, the light that goes on when we have an idea, the fire that burns, in our heart. And so, the Scriptures use these symbols to help us know the Spirit. In the first reading, the Spirit is a strong driving wind, whereas in John's Gospel, the Spirit is the gentle breath of Jesus who breathes on his apostles and says, "Receive the Holy Spirit." In either case, whether as a powerful wind or a gentle breath, the Spirit is like the invisible air we cannot live without. The Spirit is like the light that goes on in our minds when we have an idea. Jesus tells us in the Gospel, "He will guide you to all truth." Jesus couldn't explain everything to the apostles that He wanted them to know in that short period He was with them physically, but the Spirit turned on the light in their minds to be able to understand all that He had been teaching them. The Spirit also appeared to the apostles as tongues of fire, a fire that started burning in them to proclaim Christ with courage and conviction.

Our first reading bears witness to the first Pentecost. During this encounter with the Holy Spirit, the apostles and Mary felt a driving wind, there were tongues of fire on the heads of each of them, and the Spirit allowed them to speak in different tongues proclaiming acts of God. That universal language understood by all is the language of love. We might hear this reading and wish the Holy Spirit worked that obviously in our lives each day. The truth is, the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives is obvious, we just might be blind to it, or it might be that we have closed ourselves off to the Holy Spirit's wondrous works.

Our tongues of fire might be a profound conversation with a friend, something that you needed to hear in that exact moment; or a pushed-back deadline at work when you were swamped; or a moment of strength to speak the truth when you typically shy away; or even a closed door to an opportunity for something much, much greater. These are movements of the Holy Spirit in our everyday moments. The more we take time to recognize them, the more we become aware of them. So, at the close of each day, try examining how the day went. Search for the moments where you witnessed the Holy Spirit working in your daily life and the life of your family and friends.

This weekend's first reading illustrates a powerful moment of our time today—the Apostles, gathered in one place, experience a rush of a violent wind and tongues of fire representing the Holy Spirit. This Spirit gives them the power to speak in different languages, to communicate the marvels of God to diverse people. This moment underscores the universal call of the Gospel, a calling not limited by linguistic or cultural barriers. We must understand that the gift of the Holy Spirit that we received is so that we too can break barriers for the sake of the Gospel. This could mean transcending language barriers or surpassing the barriers of prejudice, misunderstanding, or intolerance.

In our second reading, St. Paul reminds us of our unique role as Christian stewards as he says, "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord... To everyone, the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit." Each one of us has been given unique gifts from the Holy Spirit. No two stewards are the same. Some of us might be confident in those gifts and some of us might not know what they are just yet. When we discover them and use them for God's work, they are multiplied beyond what we could have imagined. It is our job to look inward and pray, "Come Holy Spirit, reveal my gifts to me so that I may use them for Your glory."

On this Pentecost Sunday, let's pray as we continue to witness our faith and let the outpouring of the Holy Spirit animate our lives so that we may pursue love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. The gifts of the Holy Spirit are open to all who seek them; we are all one body with many parts, rich in diversity but unified in purpose.

May we find hope in the promise of the Holy Spirit and may the peace and empowerment it brings transform our lives and our world. Amen.

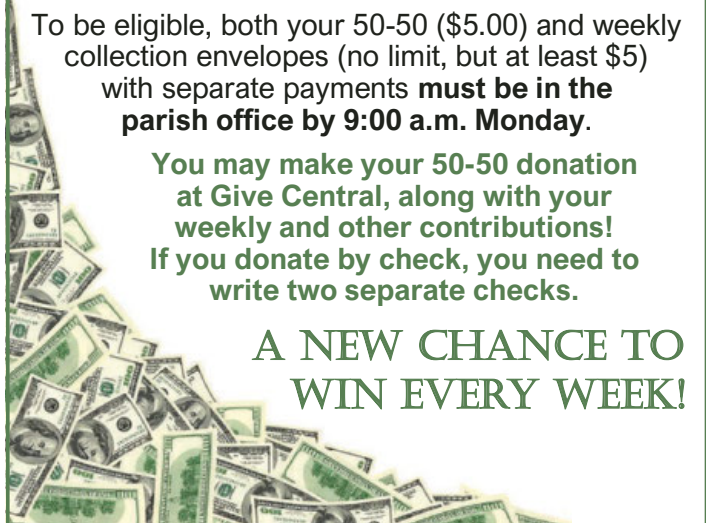

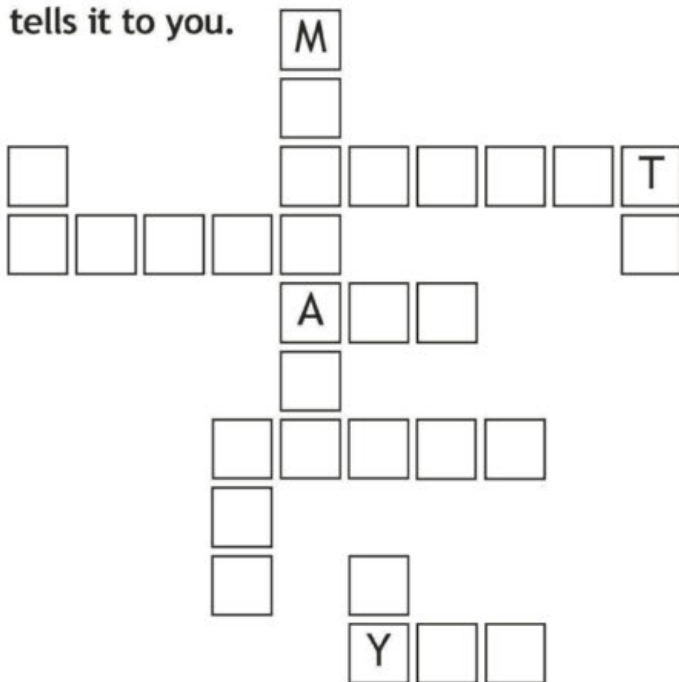
## GOSPEL
