From the Pastor's Pen & S

SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME Sheep Without a Shepherd: Mark 6:30-34

In today's Gospel, we witness a tender and poignant moment in Jesus' ministry. Last Sunday's Gospel ended with

Jesus sending His apostles out to neighboring towns to preach repentance, to heal the sick, and to drive out demons. Today's Gospel begins with their return. They have much to tell Jesus. They must have been excited to have been able to do some of the same wonderful works they had seen Jesus do. But they are also worn out. Jesus says, "You need to rest," but they aren't able to rest where they are as so many people are seeking their ministry. Their escape from the crowd proves to be unsuccessful. Jesus, ever the compassionate shepherd, recognizes their need for rest and invites them to "come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while." However, as we

see, the crowds follow them, and Jesus' reaction to them gives us a profound insight into His heart and mission.

Jesus acknowledges the exhaustion of His disciples and the necessity for rest. In our hectic and demanding lives, it's easy to become worn out. Jesus' invitation to "come away and rest" is an invitation to us all. God understands our human need for physical and spiritual replenishment. Sabbath rest and retreat are not just luxuries, but necessities for a healthy and balanced life. When we take time to rest, pray, and be in solitude with God, we renew our strength and can better serve others.

Despite the intention to rest, Jesus and the apostles are met by a large crowd. Instead of being annoyed or sending them away, Jesus is moved with compassion. He sees the crowd as "sheep without a shepherd," a poignant image that highlights their vulnerability and need for guidance. Compassion, which comes from the Latin 'compati,' meaning 'to suffer with,' involves entering into the suffering of others. Jesus demonstrates that true leadership and ministry are grounded in a profound empathy and willingness to meet people where they are.

Mark presents Jesus as the Good Shepherd, echoing the imagery from the Old Testament, particularly Psalm 23 and the prophets. A shepherd leads, protects, and cares for his flock. In Jesus, we find the ultimate Shepherd who nurtures, sustains, and guides His people. His heart radiates with love and care for the lost, broken, and weary. This shepherd's care is not an abstract or distant concern but a personal and tender involvement in the lives of His followers.


The crowd that follows Jesus is desperate for the Word of God and the hope it brings. They are hungry, not just in a physical sense, but spiritually. Today's society, too, is filled with people searching for meaning, comfort, and truth. The Church is called to be a shepherd to these souls, offering the Bread of Life—Jesus Christ—and speaking words of life into the many forms of emptiness people face.

While Jesus is the eternal Shepherd, He calls us to share in

His shepherding mission. We are called to be His hands and feet, embodying His compassion, patience, and love to those around us. Whether in our families, workplaces, or communities, we have the opportunity to guide, support, and care for others. This requires us to listen deeply, act kindly, and reflect Christ's heart in our interactions.

As we reflect on this passage, let us consider the balance of action and rest in our lives. Let us heed Jesus' call to "come away and rest," finding our renewal in Him. At the same time, may our hearts be moved with compassion for those

around us, recognizing their need for a shepherd. Let's strive to be living expressions of Jesus's love, leading others to Him, the true Shepherd of our souls. May this homily inspire us to rest in God's presence and to share His compassionate love with a world in need. Amen.


