TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Not Good to Be Alone GN 2:18-24; HEB 2:9-11; MK 10:2-16

Today's readings invite us to reflect on the profound nature of relationships—particularly the sacred union of marriage—and the importance of love in our lives.

In the beginning of life, when we were infants, we needed others if we were to survive. And at the end of life, we will again need others so that we can survive. Now here's a secret: in between, we need others as well. The Bible says, "It's not good for a human being to be alone." Sometimes it is a good and necessary thing for us to be alone, but not as a permanent condition. Human beings are social animals. Of ourselves we are incomplete. Humanity can never be acquired in solitude. We need others. To feel this need is not a sign of sickness but of health.

A survey was carried out among elderly people years ago in this country. When asked who was closest to them? Two out of three said it was their pet dog or cat. This is sad.

Insanity has been defined as a condition in which people are no longer able to connect with other people. The most dangerous lion is not the gregarious one, or the one that roars the loudest, but the silent one that walks alone. Serial killers nearly always turn out to be lonely, angry individuals. Research shows that people who commit suicide are often people who have slipped into total isolation. Isolation is the most painful condition of all. It causes people to turn in on themselves and can lead to violence and/or alcoholism. Fear, shame, and guilt make people want to stay in their isolation.

God first gave Adam the animals. But Adam was unable to find a suitable partner among them. Then God gave Adam a woman, Eve. And as soon as Adam saw Eve, he recognized in her a fitting companion and partner. She was made of the same material as himself, possessed the same dignity as himself, and therefore was his equal. True community can be created only among equals.

In marriage God answered the human need for friendship, companionship, closeness and warmth—all those things we pine for but may find so difficult. These needs can also be met by belonging to a community. And those who have a close relationship with God are never alone.

When people get married, they bring to their union not only their strengths, but also their weaknesses. All of us are wounded by sin and selfishness. To enter marriage is to enter a school of love, a school in which all are slow learners. The bond which two people seal on their wedding day is not made of unbreakable material, but of human, and therefore breakable material. The only bond that is unbreakable is the bond which God formed with us in Christ. What are the things which weaken the marriage bond? Lack of respect, poor communication, selfishness, and above all, infidelity. Respect, good communication, unselfishness, and fidelity strengthen the bond. Relationships must be worked on. They suffer from neglect just as surely as a garden does. People should not be afraid to seek help if they experience difficulties in their marriage. Relationships which have weathered some storms are the deepest. Couples must be determined to put their marriage and their children above economic success. Indissoluble monogamy is not just a clerical hobbyhorse. It finds a powerful justification in the special needs of children to be nurtured and cared for over a much longer period than almost any member of the animal species. Let us remember that every relationship requires effort and grace. In moments of difficulty, it is essential to return to the original intent of love, just as God intended in the beginning. We take inspiration from the struggles faced in our lives and can see them as opportunities for growth and deeper understanding.

Therefore, as we leave our worship gatherings, after we receive the Word of Life and are nourished in the Eucharist with the bread and wine, Jesus Himself, let us go forth renewed in our commitment to love one another as God loves us. May we strive to strengthen our bonds, reflect Christ's love, and be agents of unity in our families and communities. Amen.


