FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

We have arrived at the powerful season of Advent, a season to prepare with awe and gratitude for the Feast of the Incarnation of Jesus, born to us as Savior and Brother. A season to prepare for His return at the end of time. It is also a moment to remind ourselves that our individual judgment day is coming, too — the moment when we will be called to give an account for all the love God has shown us and the gifts He has given us during our lifetime.

As we gather on this First Sunday of Advent, we stand at the threshold of a new liturgical year, embarking on a journey of reflection and expectation. The Gospel today (Luke 21:25-28, 34-36) presents us with a vivid scene that can evoke awe and perhaps anxiety: "There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the



stars, and on the earth distress among nations." These words conjure images of cosmic upheaval but also point us toward a profound truth. The imagery before us is not merely about the end-of-times scenarios or destruction, but more about transformation and the unveiling of God's kingdom. It is an invitation to awaken from spiritual slumber and to be attentive to the divine signs around us. In every age, the people of God are challenged to find hope amidst the turmoil, to see God's hand at work even in distress.

Advent is the time of patient waiting, of hopeful watching. Jesus calls us to be vigilant, saying, "Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these

things." This vigilance is not about fear but faithfulness. It is about keeping our hearts open to God's presence and recognizing the sacred in the midst of the ordinary.

In these weeks leading to Christmas, we are given an opportunity to prepare, not only for the celebration of Jesus' birth, but also for His continual coming into our lives. How can we make room in our hearts and lives for Christ? How can we cultivate a spirit of readiness and anticipation?

This Advent, let us focus on being present—present with God and with one another. In a world that often feels chaotic and uncertain, we are reminded today that Christ comes to bring peace, instill courage, and offer redemption. Our faith empowers us to lift our heads high, for redemption is near, as the sunrise dispels the night.

Let us nurture hope by embracing simplicity and compassion, seeking the light of Christ in our homes, workplaces, and communities. May our prayers and actions align us with God's kingdom, so that the celebration of Christmas becomes a true encounter with the divine.

As we light the first candle of Advent, representing hope, let it be a symbol of our readiness and desire to live in God's light. May this flame guide us, dispelling darkness and igniting a deeper faith within us.

Finally, during Advent, we as Christian stewards must ask ourselves some hard questions. Am I staying faithful to my prayer life? Am I using my energy and skills to serve others? Am I overly concerned about material gain? Am I relying on my "stuff" or my investments as my source of comfort or security? Am I living for the moment or for the coming of the Lord?

In this holy season, let us prepare our hearts to welcome Jesus anew, embracing the Advent call to watch, wait, and hope with joy and trust. Amen.






