**THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT:
The Lord is Near**

This weekend we celebrate the third Sunday of Advent. In the days when we had Mass in Latin, today was known as Gaudete Sunday. That means “Be Joyful.” The liturgy continues to communicate that theme of joy with rose colored vestments and readings telling us to rejoice. It is a day marked by joy and anticipation as we draw nearer to the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

In our first reading (Zeph 3:14-18a), we hear the call to “shout for joy” and “sing joyfully.” Zephaniah assures the people that the Lord has removed judgments against them and that He is in their midst. This is a message of hope and redemption, affirming that God is actively present in our lives, ready to bring about transformation and joy even in times of despair. The joy of which Zephaniah speaks is not a superficial happiness, but a deep, abiding joy rooted in the knowledge that God loves us and is with us. This joy is not contingent on our circumstances but is a gift that comes from a relationship with God.

In the second reading (Phil 4:4-7), Saint Paul continues this theme by urging us to “rejoice in the Lord always.” He encourages us to embrace a spirit of gentleness and prayer, reminding us that “the Lord is near.” Paul's message is one of inner peace, born from entrusting our worries and concerns to God. In doing so, we open our hearts to the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding and guards our hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.



Finally, in the Gospel (Luke 3:10-18), we encounter John the Baptist, who prepares the way for Christ by calling people to repentance and righteous living. When asked, “What then should we do?” John gives practical advice. Share with those in need, act justly, and be content. John's message is clear: true joy comes from living a life aligned with God's will, marked by generosity, fairness, and integrity.

As we reflect on these readings, we are reminded that the essence of Gaudete Sunday is to rejoice because God is actively working in our lives and in our world. We are called to prepare our hearts by turning toward Him with anticipation and thanksgiving. This is a time to let go of our anxieties, trust in His love, and spread joy by living out the Gospel through our actions.

Joy is a choice. I think it was Abraham Lincoln who said most people are about as happy as they make up their minds to be. Most psychologists would agree. Hans Selye, the doctor who developed the notion of stress, said generally it is not the things outside of us that create stress for us, but it's the way we respond to these things.

Let us embrace this Advent season with joyful hearts, preparing a special place for Christ to dwell within us. May we bear witness to His love through acts of kindness and service, always remembering that our greatest joy comes from being with God and sharing His love with others.

Rejoice in the Lord always, dear family of faith, and may the peace of God fill your hearts in this blessed season of anticipation and hope. Amen.

Second Reading: Paul encourages the Christians in Philippi to be a community that rejoices and finds peace with God. What could you celebrate this Advent season with family or friends?

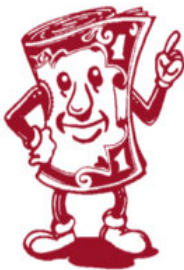
Gospel: John the Baptist encouraged the crowds, tax collectors, and soldiers to live ethically in very practical ways. How could this apply to your life this week?
