

## OUR VISION


All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.

## **THE FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY: The Finding in The Temple**

Today, as we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family, we are invited to reflect on the beautiful example set by Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Our readings today offer us profound insights into the nature of family life and the virtues that can guide us in our own families.

In the first reading (1 Sm 1:27-28), we hear the story of Hannah, who dedicates her son Samuel to the Lord. This act of dedication highlights the importance of recognizing our children as gifts from God. Hannah's willingness to entrust Samuel to God's service is a powerful reminder of the faith and trust we are called to have in God's plan for our families.

The second reading (1 Jn 3:2) speaks to God's profound love for us, calling us His children. This divine love is the foundation of all family life. As members of God's family, we are called to love one another with the same selfless and unconditional love that God shows us. This love is the bond that holds families together and enables them to reflect God's presence in the world.

In the Gospel of Luke, we encounter the familiar story of the young Jesus in the temple. Mary and Joseph, filled with anxiety, search for their Son only to find Him in His Father's house. This passage reminds us of the importance of nurturing our relationship with God within our families. Jesus' response to His parents—"Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?"—challenges us to prioritize our spiritual lives and to seek God's presence in our homes.

The Holy Family exemplifies the virtues of faith, love, and obedience. Mary and Joseph's trust in God's plan, their deep love for Jesus, and their willingness to follow God's will are qualities we can strive to emulate in our own families. By doing so, we create a home where God's love is present and where each member can grow in holiness.

As we reflect on the Holy Family, let us ask for their intercession to help us cultivate these virtues in our own lives. May our families be places of love, peace, and faith, where each member is cherished and supported. Let us also remember to pray for struggling families, that they may find


strength and hope in the example of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph.

At the end of today's Gospel, there is a very telling sentence. It goes, "Mary stored up all these things in her heart." And after the shepherds visit the manger, we find a similar comment. Luke says, "Mary treasured all these things and pondered them in her heart." (2:19) Mary kept the memory of these events in her heart to discern the hidden meaning behind the marvelous happenings.

More than once, we read in the Gospels that Mary was perplexed. So, what did she do? She pondered, reflected, and prayed, seeking to understand what was happening to her and her child. This pondering was not free from uncertainty and anxiety. Jesus did not get lost in the Temple. Rather, he began to find Himself there and to discover His true identity as the Son of God. Happy are we too if we find our true selves, as human beings and children of God. The Christian family can be a great help to us in this regard.

In conclusion, let us strive to make our families a reflection of the Holy Family, where God's love is at the center and where each member is encouraged to grow in faith and holiness. May the Holy Family guide us and bless us as we journey together in love and unity. Amen.






# FAMILY MASS


