THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD JESUS

Today, as we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we witness a profound moment that bridges Jesus's hidden life with His public ministry. This feast carries deep significance for our baptismal calling and identity as Christians.

In Isaiah 40:1-9, we hear the beautiful words, "Comfort, give comfort to my people." This prophetic voice announces the coming of the Lord, calling for valleys to be filled and mountains to be made low. This imagery speaks to the transformative nature of Christ's coming – how God enters our world to make straight what is crooked, to smooth what is rough in our lives. Like a shepherd, He gathers His lambs with care, carrying them close to His heart.

The letter to Titus (Ti 2:11-14; 3:4-7) reminds us that through baptism, we experience "the kindness and generous love of God our savior." This salvation isn't earned through our own righteous deeds, but comes through God's mercy. Through the "bath of rebirth," we are renewed by the Holy Spirit and become heirs to eternal life. This speaks directly to our own baptismal grace – a gift that transforms us into adopted children of God.

Today's Gospel (Lk 3:15-16; 21-22) is one we read every year, so it is easy to lose sight of just how incredible it is that Jesus wished to be baptized in the Jordan River by His cousin, John. We just spent the last two weeks marveling at the fact that this Savior of ours was born as a baby in a crude stable for our sake, and now this! Stop and contemplate our Lord in all His perfection waiting quietly and patiently in line with a bunch of sinners (like us!) to "lead by example." His love and humility in serving and selfgiving are beyond all telling.

Certainly, the sinless Savior did not need a baptism of repentance! John himself noted that, compared to Jesus, he was not even worthy to loosen His sandal straps. But Jesus humbly made Himself one with His people to draw us to

Him and create a relationship with us so that we would be open to His teachings and influence. In response, we should be filled to overflowing with gratitude to such a gracious God — an overflow that must express itself in giving back to God through the sharing of our time, talents, and treasures. When we allow the words and actions of Jesus in the Gospel to enter deeply into our minds and hearts, we will be compelled to give ourselves to Him and others out of love for Him.

What does Jesus' Baptism mean for us today? First, it reminds us that our own baptism is a participation in Christ's baptism. Through it, we too become beloved children of God, filled with the Holy Spirit. Second, like Jesus, our baptism marks the beginning of our mission. We are called to bring God's comfort to others, to be voices crying out in today's wilderness, preparing the way for the Lord in our world.

The Baptism of the Lord challenges us to remember and live out our own baptismal calling. Are we bringing com-

fort to God's people? Are we allowing the Holy Spirit to work through us? Are we living as God's beloved children? As we conclude the Christmas season this weekend with this feast, let us renew our baptismal commitments. Let us embrace our identity as God's beloved children and, like Jesus, begin anew our mission of



bringing God's love and mercy to our world. May we, through the grace of our baptism, become the comfort and hope our world so desperately needs.

Let us pray for the grace to live out our baptismal calling with renewed vigor and dedication, always remembering that we too are God's beloved children, in whom He is well pleased.

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is an international Christian ecumenical observance celebrated annually from January 18, the traditional Feast of the Chair of St. Peter, through January 25, the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul.

With roots going back over 100 years, the dedicated octave of prayers has been jointly commissioned and prepared since 1966, after the Second Vatican Council, by the Roman Catholic Church's Dicastery for Promoting Christian Unity and the World Council of Churches' Faith and Order Commission.

Each year Christian churches and communities from a different part of the world develop the theme and materials

for the Week of Prayer. During this week-long celebration, Christians are invited to gather with their Christian neighbors to join in prayer for Christian unity.

The 2025 theme for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is <u>Do</u><u>you believe?</u> (Jn. 11:26) Jesus announces the truth of the new Covenant to Martha, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, even if they die, will live. Those that believe in me will never die." He invites a response from Martha when he says, "Do you believe this?"

In 2025, the whole Church commemorates the 1,700th anniversary of the first Ecumenical Council of the entire church at that time, called by the Emperor Constantine at Nicaea (presently in the country of Turkey) in the early summer of 325. The result was an agreed upon Creed, what we today call the Nicene Creed.

This theme, by offering a way to see that faith is not just a static set of beliefs, but an active means of receiving grace, is most appropriate for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity in 2025. If faith can raise the dead and conquer all fear, surely faith will bring us the miracle of unity as Christians. Remembering that division, separation and rejection are symptoms of sin, the healing of the Church comes about in the power of the Holy Spirit. We pray knowing to whom it is we pray, as one community. God wills us to reconcile. God wills us to love one another. God will give those who profess the faith of Martha, of Nicaea and of all the holy ones who have gone before us, the precious gift of unity. (www.geii.org)

DO we have a specific cause? Yes! Helping someone in need, offering hope and support. Veterans, single mothers, those with medical conditions, those struggling


