


All Souls Catholic Parish aspires to be an inviting faith community where members and newcomers alike are engaged, inspired, and spiritually nourished among friends that become family.



#### FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, when Mary and Joseph brought their infant Son to the Temple in obedience to the laws of their Jewish faith. This is a beautiful, and in many ways, mysterious feast — and one that is filled with lessons for a stewardship way of life: sharing what God has given us with others.

Today's feast is difficult to understand unless you know some important Jewish laws. Firstly, every firstborn male, whether human or animal, was considered to belong to God in a special way (Exodus). When a male animal was born, it was offered up as a sacrifice. When a baby boy was born, a sacrifice was offered for the child. The second Old Testament law we need to know (Leviticus) stated that when a woman gave birth to a baby, she was not permitted to participate in Temple worship for 40 days, after which she had to go through a service of purification and offer a sacrifice to be admitted to public worship again. This explains why the Presentation is celebrated 40 days after Christmas.

Additionally, today's first reading from the prophet Malachi could use a little background explanation. The Babylonian exile was over and the Jews had returned to their homeland. They built a modest temple to replace the Temple of Solomon that the Babylonians destroyed. But the Jews were negligent in their religious responsibilities, and their worship was sloppy and lacking in sincerity. Their attitude toward God's laws was very lax. The people needed someone who would bring them back to a true love for God, back to obedience of God, and back to sincere worship. The prophet foretold that God Himself, in His love for His people, would come to the Temple to cleanse and purify the people and make them truly good and holy. Luke sees the Presentation in the Temple as a fulfillment of Malachi's prophecy. The Lord truly comes to the Temple when Jesus is brought there by Mary and Joseph. But we see such irony here. As a humble servant of God, Mary comes to be purified, she who is "full of grace." And according to the Law, she and Joseph offer a sacrifice. But Jesus, their son, would ultimately eliminate the need for any future animal sacrifices, since He would give His life as a perfect sacrifice that will save the whole world.

Our first reading (Mal 3:1-4) includes a prophecy of the event we celebrate today. Our first lesson is contained in that verse,

#### Today's Readings

First Reading: Lo, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me; and suddenly there will come to the temple the LORD whom you seek. (Mal 3:1)

Psalm: Who is this king of glory? It is the Lord! (Ps 24)

Second Reading: Therefore, he had to become like his brothers and sisters in every way, that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest before God. (Heb 2:17)

Gospel: "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation." (Lk 2:29-30)

"the Lord whom you seek." Do we truly seek the Lord by prioritizing our relationship with Him above everything (and everyone) else in our lives? If we want to know Him and His will for our lives, we must spend time with Him in daily prayer, regular participation in the sacraments, and the study of our faith. In the context of today's feast, we see this prophecy fulfilled in the presentation of Jesus in the temple. Jesus, the true messenger and the Lord Himself, comes to purify and redeem His people, bringing a new covenant of grace and mercy.

The second reading (Heb 2:14-18) emphasizes the humanity of Christ. It reminds us that Jesus shared in our flesh and blood so that He could fully understand and help us in our weaknesses. By becoming one of us, He was able to destroy the power of death and free us from the fear of death. This reading highlights the profound mystery of the Incarnation: God would become man to save us and to be our merciful and faithful high priest. In presenting Jesus at the temple, Mary and Joseph are fulfilling the law, but also presenting the Savior who will fulfill the ultimate law of love through His life, death, and resurrection.

In the Gospel (Lk 2:22-40), we witness the beautiful encounter between the Holy Family and two devout individuals, Simeon and Anna. Simeon, guided by the Holy Spirit, recognizes Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah, proclaiming Him as "a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel." Anna, a prophetess, also recognizes the child and speaks of Him to all looking for redemption. This moment in the temple is a revelation of Jesus as the light of the world, the fulfillment of God's promises, and the hope for all people. As we reflect on these readings, we are invited to consider our own presentation before the Lord. Just as Jesus was presented in the temple, we are called to present ourselves to God, allowing Him to purify and refine us. We are called to embrace the light of Christ in our lives, to recognize His presence in our midst, and to share that light with others.

Let us ask for the grace to be open to the refining work of God in our lives, to be faithful witnesses of Christ's light, and to live in the hope and joy of His salvation. May the example of Mary and Joseph, Simeon and Anna, inspire us to live lives of faith and devotion, always seeking and recognizing the presence of the Lord in our world.

As we go forth this weekend, let us carry the light of Christ into our homes, communities, and the world, shining brightly as beacons of hope and love to all those we meet. Amen.




#### 2025 Annual Catholic Appeal

#### HYGIENE DRIVE HAS A HUGE IMPACT

Our Confirmation students this year started a service project to help some of those most in need. In December and early January, the students asked the All Souls parishioners to help them collect items that would then be given to homeless shelters. Items such as toothbrushes and toothpaste, soap and shampoo, deodorant, feminine hygiene products, razors & shaving cream, hand sanitizer and wipes, socks, and washcloths were requested. I am very happy to say that the All Souls

not have jobs already, they work for the church that oversees the shelter. They are allowed to keep only a small number of personal items and expected to get additional necessities on their own. Meals at the shelter are provided by local churches and organizations throughout the area. Other community members in need often eat at these meals as well. But if no one signs up to provide a meal, then they go without. The donations collected by our students helped the men and other community members to use what little extra money they have on "luxuries" like a new change of clothes or shoes from local thrift shops.

Due to the overwhelming generosity of the All Souls parishioners, we were able to help an addi-



community really stepped up. Over 1000 items were donated, far exceeding what we had hoped for. The collected items were taken to the school building and sorted by the Confirmation 2 students so they could be delivered to homeless shelters.

At the start of the drive, the plan was to take all of the items to the Hammond City Rescue shelter located on State Street in downtown Hammond. This is a shelter for homeless men that serves Hammond and all of Northwestern Lake County in Indiana, as well as bordering communities like Calumet City and Lansing, in Illinois. Although the shelter offers men a place to lay their heads, they supply very little else. The residents are expected to work to earn their keep. If they do

This order of Sisters founded by St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta has a shelter in Gary for women and their children. Many of the women and families served by the Sister of Charity are fleeing domestic violence and have nowhere else to turn. Sr. Christa at the shelter was very grateful for the items and wanted everyone to know that she and the other Sisters will keep the parishioners and students of All

Souls in their prayers, thanking God for your generosity.


